No cover(s) found so far.


The fifties



FIVB cover (airmail paper but without label "Par Avion") from Paris (Bd. de Strasbourg) to US Volleyball Association in New York on April 14, 1954. The cover has a French control cancel "2". Airmail covers were always controlled about the weight due to the additional postage which had to be paid for airmail. The rate was Francs 23,00 per 5 gr. The basic rate for foreign destinations in that period was Francs 30,00. The weight of the cover must have been between 10 and 15 gr. In that case the rate for this cover was $(30 + 3 \times 23 =)$ Francs 99,00 and rounded off (not uncommon in that period) to Francs 100,00.


The sixties



From internet

Cover (by airmail) Chinese Federation from Beijing to FIVB in Paris (Boulevard de Strasbourg) on February 18, 1960.

The text in the upper right corner is in both cases: "AIRMAIL". The cover sticks 52 Fen in total. In that period the basic rate for international destinations was 22 Fen + 30 Fen for airmail. So the cover is franked correctly.



Registered cover Chilean Federation from Santiago (Correo Aereo) to FIVB in Paris (Rue d'Anjou) on May 3, 1962.


On January 1, 1960 the currency from Chile changed from Peso (\$) to Escudo (1000 Pesos became 1 Escudo). The cover has two stamps from 1958 in Pesos and four stamps from 1960; 1961 and 1962 in Centesimos. Nowadays Chile has the Chilean Peso (CLP) again.

The airmail rate in 1962 to Europe is unknown to me but the cover is franked with Escudos 0,25.

The cover has also a registered label from Banco de Londres y America del Sud Limitado. In 1962 the Chilean Federation organized the fifth South American Championship for Men and Women in Santiago. Perhaps the fee to be paid to the FIVB was part of the cover.

The seventies




FIVB airmail cover from Paris, cancel Gare Monteparnasse to FIPAV in Rome (Italy) on June 19, 1978.



The eighties

Registered FIVB airmail cover from 1001 Lausanne, Av. de la Gare (without telephone-, telex and fax number) to NeVoBo in Woerden (Netherlands) on June 10, 1996 with **digital** registered label and confirmation of delivery (C5) of registered mail at backside.
